Grade 12 Scholarship - Getting Started Package

Step 1 - Get organized:

You will need to have a binder to put all your scholarship and bursary information in, along with application forms and work in process. Try using dividers as an extra organization strategy.

Step 2 - Research:

If you are interested in knowing about a specific school, what scholarships they have available and their requirements for admission and scholarship applications, Google the school and or use some of the information found throughout our Scholarship Website: MSSscholarshipinfo.weebly.com. Make sure to make note of required information and keep it in your binder for further reference (e.g. Scholarship opening dates and application deadlines).

Step 3 - Know your dates:

Get a current year's calendar and make note of application deadlines both for scholarships and entry to post-secondary institutions of your choice.

Step 4 - Be proactive:

Download the "Getting Started Guide" package on our Scholarship Website (MSSscholarshipinfo.weebly.com). Get in touch with Mrs. Thompson (Scholarship Coordinator) or Ms. Pearce at window #4 - Main Office. Also be sure to check the Scholarship Information Bulletin Board outside of the Counselling Centre on a regular basis, and talk with your counsellor. Follow "mss_scholars" on Instagram for the most up to date information.

Step 5 - Be resourceful:

Ask your parents/guardians and grandparents to check with their bank, credit union, workplace, union office, church, Legion, Elks, Rotary and other affiliations within the community to see if there are scholarships or bursaries available to the children of employees, members and clients.

Step 6 - Ask questions:

Drop by Room 223 every second Thursday during lunch for scholarship support or book an appointment with Mrs. Thompson at Alexandra.thompson@mpsd.ca

Step 7 - Check it out:

Visit the MSS Scholarship Website to see what scholarships have been available in

previous years. It is a good idea to check out the website to see what information it has for you.

Step 8 - Scholar Tree:

Scholar Tree is a scholarship matching website that is free for students to use. See instructions on the next page.

√ AWARDS ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY:

 Research to find awards for which you qualify. Awards may be offered through your parents' work or your bank or financial institution as well.

√ START EARLY:

• It takes time to prepare a good application; time for teachers and others to write letters of reference; time to prepare transcripts; time to get the principal's signature; time to revise your application.

 Prepare a documentation package. Different awards require different documents so check the specific instructions carefully. Some application procedures may require information about you in an essay or letter, while others may have detailed forms. Either way, having the information prepared can save time and energy.

√CONTENT:

• Be Comprehensive: Include everything that represents a commitment of time (volunteer work, work experience, honour roll, clubs, hobbies).

 Be Specific: Provide details. Avoid general statements such as, "I like to work with people." Instead tell who you've worked with, on what project, with what results, current as well as past activities.

• Sell Yourself: Explain specifically what you have done or enjoyed about your academic experiences. Go into detail about some aspect of courses or projects you have worked on.

 Proof Read and Revise: Have your work read by people who care about you and who know how to write well.

√ KEEP YOUR ORIGINALS:

 Submit photocopies of the above documents with your application as required. You are responsible for your own photocopying.

√ PLAN AHEAD:

- · Request application forms as early as possible.
- Ask for letters of reference, early.

Give your referees plenty of time to write a good letter on your behalf.

√ WHEN IN DOUBT, APPLY:

· Don't hold back. Let the judges decide if you are qualified for an award.

√ FILL OUT THE APPLICATION FORM:

Most organizations provide a detailed application form.

√ DO IT RIGHT:

Make a photocopy of each form to use as a working copy.

· Use black ink on your final copy. Blue and red do not photocopy well.

Do not use white-out or any correction fluids anywhere in your application. Erase your errors carefully and completely if you make a mistake. Never cross out or write over an entry.

 Give full answers to every question in the form. Mark response boxes with an X: no check marks, no words. Never write in the margins or outside the answer boxes. Attach a separate letter to clarify or add to the information requested.

· Be sure you (and your parents if necessary) date and sign all forms.

 Send your application by registered mail and keep your dated receipt from Canada Post. You may be asked to prove your mailing date.

√ FOLLOW UP:

 Whenever you apply for an award, ask about other possible scholarship or bursary sources.

√ WHEN YOU RECEIVE AN AWARD:

Send a thank you letter to the DONOR!!!!!!

DEFINITIONS

Scholarship: Primarily based onacademicachievement; demonstration of community mindedness in and outside of school may be expected.

Bursary: Primarily based on financial need; demonstration of community mindedness in and outside of school may be expected.

Government Student Loans: These are distributed by the federal and provincial governments and are LOANS which must be paid back with interest; the main qualification is financial need; applications are usually sent to secondary schools in May. When applying for a loan, you will also be considered for a Government Grant which does not have to be paid back.

Private Student Loans: Many financial institutions provide special loans for post secondary education; see specific organizations for more information.

Summary of Accomplishments

School-Based Volunteer:

- Yearbook: I joined yearbook to connect with my peers and to support the development of the book that holds the memories and the legacy of our graduating class. My role on the yearbook committee includes photographing and writing articles on student trips, clubs and academics. I also input ideas on the colour scheme and fonts of the book as well as provide advice on major projects like the cover. I have connected with many students through yearbook and have come to appreciate the diversity of our school and how each unique perspective of a student adds value to our school's legacy.
- Global Education: Through a school organized class called Global Education, we travelled to Fiji to improve the educational resources of children attending a local school. We built an entire classroom and added a set of computers to support their learning through the use of technology. I was responsible for leading the mixing and placement of the cement for the structure. The room was made to last and withstand all weather conditions which included sturdy walls and a concrete base. We were able to give approximately 50-70 children the educational resources necessary to improve their overall education and ultimately give them an opportunity for a new life.
- Teaching Assistant for a Kindergarten Class: Volunteering at a local elementary school has allowed me to gain practical work experience in a teaching environment. I am a teaching assistant for kindergarten and Grade 1 students who need help with alphabet recognition and sight words. I help my students by giving them achievable tasks that are tailored to their learning style. I also try to create an inclusive learning environment, where students know it is acceptable to fail and try again. I have learned about education-related topics such as "growth mindset" from experienced educators and have been able to put these topics into practice in the classroom.
- Server for the Tea before prominight: Throughout the year, I worked alongside my Caleteria instructor in many of the Caleteria Training classes. When she brought up the opportunity for Graduation Tea, I knew I wanted to help. I supported her through being a server during the annual parent and student Graduation Tea. I was required to set up trays with fruit and bite-sized snacks in an aesthetically pleasing arrangement. As the graduating class came in from taking photos, I served the deserts to the students and their guests. It was a great experience to be able to give back to the students who had been a mentor to me throughout high school.

Community-Based Volunteer experience

- Cookin' Kids Program Assistant Leader: I have volunteered with the District of Missions Cookin' Kids program since the spring of 2016. I aim to improve the cooking skills of the children I teach white using cooking as a tool to develop other critical life skills such as teamwork and communication. The program requires me to take charge and have a thought out and organized plan on how the class should progress. I focus on keeping the recipe on track, while still maintaining a safe and fun environment for learning and development. I have seen the children increase their confidence and share their recipes with their peers at school.
- Adopt-a-Block Cleanup: I volunteered with a local youth group to participate in an Adopt a Block Cleanup in my local area. I noticed a lot of litter in my community and was inspired to be part of a team to create a sustainable change in our neighbourhood. As a group, we were assigned to groups of 3-4 people to go to different blocks around town to clean up garbage in that area. Cleanup was a rewarding experience because I saw the immediate difference in the cleanliness of our community and how this difference encouraged others in our neighbourhood to be responsible with their trash.
- MCC Meal Preparation: With a local youth group we worked together to prepare soup mixes for people in Africa who were affected by widespread famine. We were in charge of the vegetables that were to be turned into soup mixes. These mixes were aimed to be an easy set up once they reached their destination because they just need to have water added to be a nutritious meal. Throughout the night we cleaned and cut up donated vegetables, such as peppers, carrots and potatoes, from stores in the area.
- Tutoring in various academic courses: From Grades 10 to 12, I tutored a fellow student
 in her academic classes including English and Math. I supported her in making study
 plans, going over material from the day, or completing upcoming assignments. Tutoring
 was a great learning experience for me as it was an opportunity to tutor individually,
 which is much different than a classroom environment. I was able to improve my
 communication skills, while also improving my own understanding of the learning
 material for my own exams.

Paid Work Experience:

Dishwasher at The Blackberry Kitchen: I was responsible for doing the restaurant's dishes as well as preparing the necessary ingredients for service. Prep work included their brunch menus as well as lunch and dinner menus to maintain a well-stocked kitchen at all times. To make sure the necessary tasks were complete, I had to come up with a personal system of organization. My job required time management skills to ensure that tasks were completed on time and supplies for the kitchen was fully stocked. I also communicated with the front of house staff and chefs to maintain the proper stock of ingredients and dishes in their area.

Booster Juice employee: I am responsible for preparing food and beverages for customers while ensuring they have a positive customer experience at our location. To create a friendly environment for the customers there is a cleaning schedule to maintain the necessary sanitary standards. When interacting with the staff and customers, I maintain a positive attitude to improve both customer and team morale. I have built strong communication and teamwork skills by delegating roles and responsibilities to other staff as well as being receptive to feedback from other employees in order to improve.

Achievements and Awards

- English 10 Award: Throughout the school year, I exceeded expectations in my classwork through spending extra time with the teacher and thoroughly studying for tests and final exams, resulting in the top mark in my class for the 2016-2017 school year. Although the award was a great achievement, I am most proud that I connected with students in the same class to also support their learning. I created a study group to go over materials collectively and we all saw an improvement in our marks through this initiative.
- Leadership 9 Award: During the 2015-2016 school year, I showed great improvement in
 my leadership skills through my involvement in many school activities. I helped run the
 Halloween dance as well as other events such as spirit week or the grade six tours of the
 school. Through a vote of my classmates and teacher, I was awarded the leadership
 award. After this class, I was empowered to take on more leadership positions in my
 high school years such as Global Education and the cooking class that I teach.
- Honnor and Effort Roll Grade 10 and 11: During my grade 10 and 11 years, I devoted an extensive effort into my schooling in order to support my goal of becoming a teacher. In classes I had troubles with I made sure I spent extra time with teachers or studied with peers to have a better grasp of the material. During this time I also figured out the best way for me to study, so that I was able to maximize my time and learn everything needed. Because of my focus and achievement in school, I was able to reach the effort roll and honour roll standing in all terms of my Grade 10 and 11 years.
- In my first semester of Grade 12, I achieved the Honnor Roll, Effort Roll, Principal's list, and a 4.0 grade point average.

Autobiographical Essay

Most scholarship applications ask for an autobiographical essay or for some personal information.

In order to assist you in this process you are asked to write a 500 word essay about yourself.

Many students in the past have found this particular assignment a difficult task. Below are a few ideas of what you can include in your essay.

- Strengths: things that you are good at doing, sports, problem solving etc.
- Experiences: work volunteer, adventures etc.
- Goals: what are your plans for the future
- Skills: FoodSafe, woodworking, music, specific computer programs etc.
- Interests: things that you like to do
- Hobbies: scrap booking, painting etc.
- Events that you have participated in
- Issues that you may have overcome
- Virtually anything that you would like to say about yourself

Sometimes it can be a challenge to write an autobiographical essay where you are expected to discuss your strong points. With a few simple changes and rephrasing of information you can make everyday activities into marketable skills.

My Biographical Sketch

There is a diverse assortment of cookie types: chocolate chip, shortbread, oatmeal, and countless more. In each of these, there is a variety of ingredients used. A big part of who I am is reflected in my future plans. Up until a year ago, I was sure I was going to be a marine biologist, but then I entered Mrs. Anderson's psychology 11 class. The options for future careers grew that much broader. After having to do a research project on a career of my choice, I decided I wanted to be a speech pathologist. As I was doing my research, I realized with this career path not only will I still see those who are struggling, but I will then have the education to help them. I will be able to take that person's pain and shape it into confidence and strength. To get the right education, I will first be getting my bachelors of arts in psychology at the University of Victoria. After those four years, I will have to transfer to another university to get my masters in speech-language pathology. Hopefully, before I graduate with my masters, I will have been able to take advantage of co-op programs and other resources to gain experience in the field of speech pathology. As a speech pathologist, I would be treating speech, language, voice, fluency, swallowing, and feeding problems. My hope is to focus on working with children in schools, hospitals, or my own private practice. For now, I am excited to see where life at university takes me!

Autobiographical Essay

In sixth grade I aided a kindergarten teacher running craft groups, putting up artwork, or helping the kids get ready for the end of the school day. Although my involvement started early, I am part of a work experience class where I will aid students with sight words and letter recognition. It is my dream to inspire children to be the best they can because if encouraged at a young age, they can do anything they set their mind to. To do achieve this I aim to become a Child Psychologist or an Elementary School Teacher.

In Grade 10, I joined a school program called Global Education, which aims to educate students on the standards of living in other countries. Through this program, my class and I had the opportunity to go to Fiji and build a classroom for underprivileged children. Together, we placed the foundation for a sidewalk made from hand-mixed cement. We also aided them by putting up the wall structure and roofing with the limited resources available. After working each day, we would play soccer and other sports with the kids after their classes were out. Building this classroom and providing computers to the school allowed over 50 children the opportunity to access education. From this opportunity, I began to see myself as a leader and realized I can make a difference in people's lives.

Once I returned home I began to focus more on a community cooking class, called Cookin' Kids. I began to develop skills in how to engage students and understand the way they learn to better improve my own ways of teaching. I support and guide the children in taking on responsibility and working collectively through the various recipes. I focus on keeping the recipe on track through thought out pre-class planning, which allows for a smooth and understandable lesson for the kids. For better work flow in the classroom, I keep the recipe as the focus, while still maintaining a safe and fun environment for the children to develop and learn. Biographical Sketch:



Your resume does not get you the job, it gets you the interview. You have to prove to the employer that you deserve an interview, through your resume.

There is no single right way to do a resume. You choose how you want to format it BUT here are some tips:

All resumes should be ...

- printed in black ink on pale paper (white or off-white);
- word-processed in a style that is easy to read and laser printed, if possible;
- two pages or less; usually going beyond two pages is a sign of too much information or a bad layout style;
- identified with your name as the largest item and your contact information (address, phone number, email address) at the top;
- free from information about you that could be used for illegal discrimination, such as age, gender, race, social insurance number, religion, height, or weight;
- designed to highlight your strongest points;
- · full of positive, true, relevant information;
- not too heavy on the layout features such as bold, underline, and italics;
- written in the third person (do not use "l");
- · written using bullets and point form rather than paragraphs,
- · written in the correct tense (use the dates of your activities as a guide);
- worded using strong action verbs, for example, "maintained a clean working environment" rather than "cleaned up";
- consistent! If you use an abbreviation, spacing or layout feature, use it consistently throughout the whole resume;
- free from all typos and spelling mistakes;
- free from wrinkles and stains;
- changed to target the job for which you are applying;
- delivered in person, when possible, and / or presented with a cover letter.
